



Discussion Questions
Moses: Learning to Trust, Finding Deliverance
Week Two

1. Review the story of Moses so far.

What is the situation in Egypt for the Hebrew People?

What happened with Moses at birth?

2. Read **Exodus 2:11-14**

What is so significant about Moses watching and seeing what is happening to his people?

Why do we (& so many followers of God) often choose not to see suffering/pain/injustice around us?

Share a time when you started seeing something in our world differently. Did you feel God asking you to do something about it?

In this passage, Moses tries to do the right thing, the wrong way. How have you experienced that in your life?

3. Read **Exodus 2:15-17**

What does this part of the story tell us about Moses' heart and God's heart for Moses?

4. Read **Exodus 2:18-22**

What does the fact that Moses still identifies as an Egyptian and then names his son "Gershom" tell us?

Is there something you are still identifying as that's holding you back from being who God has called you to be?

Pastor Dave talked about how Midian represents a place of obscurity where God does work in us in preparation for work he wants to do through us. How have you experienced Midian in your life? What work did God need to do in you there?

5. Read **Exodus 3:1-6**

What do you think we can learn about God from this bush?

Have you ever considered that what makes a place holy is God's presence? Where are some areas you see God showing up in your life that you might call "holy."

6. Read **Exodus 3:7-12**

This Section is all about what God is and will do. We also notice that God doesn't pump Moses up but instead promises to go with him.

What does that teach us about tackling the callings & challenges we face in the world?

7. Read **Exodus 3:13-14**

What do you think God is saying to Moses as he reveals His name?

What is one action you might take because of the message this week?
